The faculty involved in organizing these events also took this opportunity to explain the students about the courses being run in the University Campus.

Academic Council



The 12th Meeting of the Academic Council of Lingaya`s University was held on December 23, 2015 (Wednesday) at 10.30 A.M. at Lingaya`s University, Faridabad. The meeting was held under the chairmanship of Vice Chancellor, Professor R.K. Chauhan.

Dean Academic Affairs, Prof A. K. Nadir apprised the Council of the various Academic Activities conducted in the university after the 11th Academic Council meeting. Vice Chancellor briefed the members of the Academic council about the NAAC visit and informed the Council that the University has been Accredited Successfully with "B Grade". It was again reiterated by the Vice Chancellor that as decided in earlier Academic Council Meetings, every department shall hold one National Conference/Seminar every year and one International Conference/Seminar once in every two years. It was further agreed that even the Non-Teaching department such as Administration, Finance and Transportation etc. may organize conference either individually or in association with an Academic department.

It was agreed to have a thorough revision of Curricula, Syllabi and Scheme of Examination of all the Programs which were revised four or more years before. It must be ensured that the current state-of -the-Art Technologies which are widely used by Industries and Organizations may be incorporated so as to help our students to be ready for the job market conversant with New Technologies. The revised Curricula would be made available for next session for the students admitted in Academic Session 2016-17.

It was decided to implement CBCS system as advised by UGC for UG programs in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics, English, B.Com (and BBA if applicable) from Academic Year 2015-16, as recommended by the various Board of studies.

The Ph.D regulations of the University "Lingaya`s PhD Regulation-2015" which are in line with UGC regulations were discussed and it was decided that all, PhD cases shall be processed accordig to these regulations only.

Details of higher studies being pursued by faculty memebers and other staff memebers from various departments were placed before the Academic Council for perusal and the Council noted the same. The various Awards and Felicitations won by faculty memebers were placed before the Academic Council and the Council appreciated the achievements of the faculty memebers and students. The various new Programs being introduced from new session 2015-16 were noted and approved. The Academic Calendar for various UG & PG courses being offered by the University was discussed and approved.

All the candidates seeking admission to various Programmes of the University must apply on-line/off-line as per the prescribed format available on the Website/Information Brochure. All admissions shall be made purely on merit basis with the process of admission as given below:

A. Admission to Ph. D Program

1. Eligibility

(i) Ph. D in Engineering / Technology or related disciplines, the candidate must have minimum 60% marks or minimum grade point equivalent to 60% marks in M. E / M. Tech in the concerned subject or related/allied disciplines.

(ii) Ph. D in Management, Pharmacy or Non-Engineering Disciplines, the candidate(s) must have minimum 55% marks or equivalent Grade in PG Degree in the concerned subject or related /allied disciplines.

2. Admission Process : The admission to Ph. D is through a process of Admission Test followed by Interview as detailed below:

(i) The interested candidates shall apply through a formal Application Form, as prescribed, available on the Website of the University or from the Accounts Section of the University.

(ii) Admission Entrance Test shall be conducted by the University as per syllabi of various courses available on the Website of the University. After the written test, interview shall be conducted for the candidates who qualify the written examination. The weightages for the written test and Interview shall be 50% each. Minimum qualifying marks for the written test as well as for interview shall be 40%.

(iii) Candidates who have qualified in UGC / CSIR (JRF) / NET / SLET / GATE / M.Phil. (As a Regular Candidate from UGC Recognized University for admission to non-engineering disciplines), may not be required to appear for the Entrance Test of the University. However, their appearance in the interview shall be mandatory for admission. The weightage for the Interview in such cases shall be 100 %. Minimum qualifying marks for the Interview shall be 50%.

(iv) A merit list will be prepared Department wise for admission based on the marks obtained in the Entrance Test and Interview or Interview for candidates who have been exempted from the Entrance Test.

(v) Admission is open twice in a year- Winter Session (Dec-January) and Summer Session. (June-July). The exact dates for the same shall be notified on the Website of the University.

(vi) Only a pre-determined number of students, depending upon available vacancy of seats shall be selected for admission to the Ph. D program.

(vii) Candidates will be admitted only those areas of specialization for which resources and facilities are available in the University.

Admission Policy 2016

B. Admission to B. Tech Program

1. Eligibility: Pass in 10+2 with minimum 55% marks in Physics, Mathematics, and one of either Chemistry or Computer Science subjects (PCM) combined.
2. Admission shall be based on merit in JEE Advanced followed by JEE Mains for the rest of the seats followed by merit in 10+2 (physics, chemistry and mathematics) for the rest of the seats for the applications received by the specified date(s) of receipt of applications.
3. Lateral Entry: Minimum 60% Pass marks in Polytechnic Diploma (Engg/Tech) or minimum 55% pass marks or equivalent in B.Sc.
4. For getting scholarship, the candidates need to appear in the Scholarship Test conducted by the University.

C. Admission to B. Arch Program

1. Eligibility: Minimum 55% Pass marks in 10+2 with mathematics as one of the subjects and pass in NATA (National Aptitude Test in Architecture) conducted by Council of Architecture.
2. Admissions shall be based on Merit in NATA for the applications received by the specified date (s) for the receipt of applications.
3. For getting scholarship, the candidates need to appear in the Scholarship Test conducted by the University.

D. Admission to M. Arch Program

1. Eligibility: Minimum 55% Pass marks in B.Arch.
2. Admission shall be based on merit in B. Arch marks for the applications received by the specified date(s) for the receipt of applications.
3. For getting scholarship, the candidates need to appear in the Scholarship Test conducted by the University.

E. Admission to B. Pharm Program

1. Eligibility: Pass in 10+2 with 55% marks in Physics, Chemistry and any one subject out of mathematics, Biotechnology, Computer Science or Biology combined.
2. Admission shall be based on merit in 10+2 marks for the applications received by the specified date(s) for the receipt of applications.
3. For lateral Entry, the eligibility is 60% at Diploma in Pharmacy from PCI approved institutions.
4. For getting scholarship, the candidates need to appear in the Scholarship Test organized by the University.

F. Admission to Diploma in Pharmacy Program

1. Eligibility: Pass in 10+2 examination with Science (academic Stream) /any other qualification as approved by PCI (Pharmacy Council of India) with a minimum of 50% marks.
- 2 Admission based on the merit in 10+2 marks for the applications received by the specified date(s) for the receipt of applications.
3. For getting scholarship, the candidate needs to appear in the Scholarship Test conducted by the University, subject to the availability of scholarships.

G. Admission to MBA Program

1. Eligibility: Pass in the qualifying examination with 50% marks.
2. Admission shall be based on merit in CAT followed by merit in CMAT followed by merit in MAT followed by marks in the qualifying examination subject to qualifying by passing in the Interview and/or Group Discussion conducted by the University with a minimum of 50% marks for the applications received by the specified date(s) of receipt of applications.
3. For getting scholarship, the candidate may appear in the Scholarship Test conducted by the University, subject to the availability of scholarships.

H. Admission to Other Programs

1. Eligibility: As per the minimum marks prescribed in the prospectus (50% for undergraduate programs and 55% for postgraduate programs).
2. Merit in the qualifying course/class/degree shall be the basis for admission to all other Programs.
3. For getting scholarship, the candidate may appear in the Scholarship Test conducted by the University, subject to the availability of scholarships.

I. Concession for CBSE Board. Students who are from the CBSE Board can avail of 5% concession in marks for the programme where the minimum eligibility is 10+2.

J. Government regulations The admissions shall be in accordance with the mandatory regulations of the Government with respect to certain programs, wherever applicable.

K. Other/Important points

1. The University may review the applications received during a particular period and admit students based on their eligibility/position of merit during that period. This period shall be decided by the University.

Admission Policy 2016

2. The University reserves the right to give spot admission to students who have scored above a specific high percentage of marks in the qualifying Course/Degree/JEE/NATA etc. as decided by the Vice Chancellor from time to time. The applicants are advised to apply in the first call (i.e. the last date for the first decision of selection) in their own interest for a better possibility of their admission.

3. All the applicants (who have not gone through any relevant entrance test such as JEE, CAT etc.), will go through a personal interview/discussion to decide their suitability. If not satisfied with the same, the University may conduct an entrance examination for those students to decide their suitability for pursuing the intended program.

4. All the students desirous of getting scholarship are required to undergo through the Scholarship test. The scholarship will be decided based on the combined merit of marks in qualifying course/degree and the scholarship test.

5. The applications for admission of only those candidates, who have passed the qualifying course/degree from recognized Board/University/Institution, will be considered. L. Changes in the Admission Policy: The University reserves the right to modify/change the above admission policy based on the powers vested upon the Vice Chancellor of the University.
